

CARROLL COUNTY COURTS
Modification of Courthouse Operations
Effective June 1, 2020

In the interest of public health, and in order to comply with Ohio Governor Mike DeWine's Executive Order, and the various Executive Orders of the Ohio Director of Public Health, the Courts will implement the following procedural changes beginning at 8:00AM on June 1, 2020,

1. The Courthouse will be open to the public Monday through Friday from 9:00AM to 3:00PM. Only those individuals over the age of 65, have a compromised immune system, or those with specific appointments may enter from 8:00AM to 9:00AM.
2. All individuals entering the Courthouse shall be subject to a non-invasive scan for elevated body temperature. Any individual, including employees, with an elevated temperature will be denied access to the Courthouse. It is highly recommended that facial masks be worn while in the courthouse.
3. Access MAY be temporarily refused by security staff to any visibly-ill person.
4. Any person who is not an attorney, prosecutor, law enforcement officer, plaintiff, defendant, subpoenaed witness, victim or victim advocate having business with the Courts may be limited to access to courtrooms and waiting areas.
5. Media shall have access in accordance with Ohio Sup. R. 12 per normal procedure.

This is an evolving situation and may change pursuant to federal, state, and local guidance and directives.



**TEMPORARY ORDER IN RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19
(CORONAVIRUS) PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS**

In the interest of public health, and in order to comply with Ohio Governor Mike DeWine's Executive Orders, and the various Executive Orders of the Ohio Director of Public Health, the Court will implement the following procedural changes effective June 1, 2020.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. The Municipal Court Local Rules of Court may be temporarily adapted to allow Court flexibility, within Constitutional limits, in response to the public health emergency.
2. The Municipal Court security policies may be temporarily amended or supplemented to protect public health while maintaining essential court functions.
3. The Municipal Court Employee Handbook provisions may be temporarily adjusted to maintain essential court operations and functions.
4. The Municipal Court authorizes the use of audiovisual devices and technologies for all actions and proceedings.
5. The public health emergency may be considered to be a finding of good cause for continuances deemed necessary by assigned Judges on a case-by-case basis.
6. The Court will have the lawful authority, within constitutional limits, to do and direct to be done all things necessary to ensure the orderly and efficient administration of justice for the duration of the declared public health emergency.

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY AND UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE:

1. The arraignment date for all new general traffic citations will be **every other WEDNESDAY at 1:00PM**. The current arraignment dates on Monday and Thursday are cancelled.
2. All appearances and hearings are limited to attorneys, defendants, witnesses, victims, and people making payments. Individuals that do not have business before the Court will not be permitted in the Courtroom.

3. Incarcerated defendants' arraignment will be held on a daily basis by video. The public will not be permitted into inmate arraignments and initial appearances until further notice.
4. Vehicles that are towed, the Defendant may contact the court for a release. Said release will be provided to the Defendant or be available at the Carroll County Sheriff's Office.
5. Payments for fines, costs, and restitution can be made at the Carroll County Sheriff's Office. Only an exact amount pre-order of payment or total amount owed will be accepted. The Sheriff's Office will NOT make change.
6. Bonds for traffic tickets can be paid online at www.carrollcountycourt.org instead of coming to court. If you are making payments to the Court and are unable to pay online for any reason, please call the Court at (330) 627-5049 Option 3.
7. All civil and small claims trials, garnishment hearings shall be continued or held by telephone, as deemed necessary by the Court. Eviction hearings will be held on a case by case basis.




IN THE MATTER OF:
